

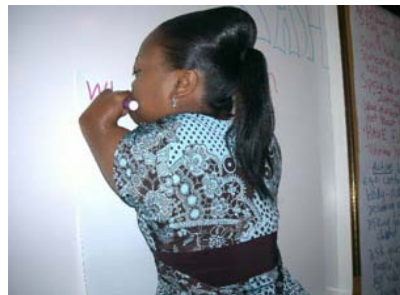
KASA Presentations

Kids As Self Advocates (KASA) provides workshops and presentations for youth and adults on a wide variety of topics, including:

- Transition, including: strategies, healthcare, school to work, school to college, college to “adult-world”, etc.
- Self-advocacy
- Self-determination
- Adaptive sports/recreation
- Disability history
- Going to college with a developmental disability
- Education laws
- Managing your own healthcare
- Working with service animals
- Youth leadership/involvement
- Getting what you need out of an IEP
- Disability culture
- Developing youth-friendly and accessible materials and more
- Sharing personal experiences, success stories and how to know your individual strengths
- How to work with your PCA (Personal Care Assistant)

KASA can also work with your group to design a workshop to meet your needs.

Note: Full workshop and TA fees paid to the KASA Project Director are retained by KASA. Youth consultants and leaders receive half of the fee paid to KASA on their behalf. Fees do not include KASA rep/ PCA travel, meals, transportation and lodging.

Technical Assistance (TA) and/or Consulting

KASA provides groups with technical assistance (one-on-one support) on a wide variety of topics, including:

- Review of materials to ensure they are youth friendly/accessible and useful for youth
- Organizational development support for youth and disability organizations (strategic planning, developing an evaluation plan, etc.)
- Disability history, disability culture
- Self-advocacy
- Participant sustainability (how to keep people involved)
- Youth leadership - including how to incorporate youth as leaders in your organization/agency
- Developing and marketing youth-friendly/accessible materials, curricula and workshops
